# Background to the Directory

- Provision for practitioners to meet the knowledge element of the practitioner standards – OU:K311 no longer an option

## Considerations..

- What else is available/how do we collate that information/are there any limitations?
- Who is the target audience?
- Funding a project to deliver a directory

# Project Objectives

- To scope the training and education available to practitioners for the purposes of demonstrating knowledge competencies against each individual UKPHR PHP Standard
- To produce a training directory; mapping training and education against each individual UKPHR PHP Standard, categorising the training by qualification level
- Highlight those standards where there is limited training and education available

# Scoping and Training Directory

Education and learning opportunities identified were mapped to include:

- Course name and link
- Provider
- Course details – time required (contact and non-contact); teaching method (eg face to face v online); assessment details
- Cost
- Qualification level
- Certification/ accreditation
- Quality assurance
- UKPHR PHP Standards covered

# Limited Training Opportunities

- *1.2 – Use an ethical approach in your area of work, identifying ethical dilemmas or issues arising and how you address them.*
- *1.6 -Act within the limits of your competence, seeking advice where needed.*
- *1.7 – Continually develop own practice by reflecting on your behaviour and role identifying where you could make improvements.*
- *2.6 Interpret and present information using appropriate analytical methods for qualitative data*
- *7.6 – Demonstrate how quality assurance principle or policies are applied when planning or implementing a public health intervention.*
- *8.3 – Demonstrate awareness of the effect the media can have on public perception of health and wellbeing.*
